Legislative Counsel’s Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 947, as it passed the Senate, prohibited an employer, as defined, from using an automated decision system (ADS) to perform certain functions and limited the purposes for and way in which an ADS may be used. SB 947, as it passed the Senate, authorized a worker to request, and required an employer to provide, a copy of the most recent 12 months of the worker’s own data primarily used by an ADS to make a disciplinary, termination, or deactivation decision. SB 947, as it passed the Senate, required an employer that primarily relied upon an ADS to make a disciplinary, termination, or deactivation decision to provide the affected worker with a written postuse notice, as specified.

The Assembly amendments, instead, make these provisions operative on July 1, 2027. The Assembly amendments revise the definition of employer, as specified, and includes in that definition a farm labor contractor or foreign labor contractor, as specified. The Assembly amendments, among other changes, require an employer that primarily relies upon an ADS output to make a disciplinary or termination decision, to direct a human to corroborate the decision using data that was collected or used to produce the ADS output or other relevant corroborating or supporting information. The Assembly amendments authorize an employee, when an employer primarily uses an ADS to make a disciplinary or termination decision, to request, and require an employer to provide, a description of the employee’s own data primarily used by an ADS to make a disciplinary or termination decision, as specified. The Assembly amendments require an employer that primarily relied upon an ADS to make a disciplinary or termination decision to provide the affected employee with a written postuse notice, as specified.

SB 947, as it passed the Senate, required the Labor Commissioner to enforce the bill’s provisions, and authorized, in the alternative, any worker who has suffered a violation of these provisions to bring a civil action for damages. SB 947, as it passed the Senate, set forth specified types of relief that a plaintiff may seek and specified penalties that an employer that violates these provisions is subject to, including a \$500 civil penalty.

The Assembly amendments, instead, authorize the Labor Commissioner to enforce the bill’s provisions. The Assembly amendments provide that, in a civil

action or administrative proceeding brought for improper use of an ADS, as specified, once it has been demonstrated that an ADS was used to make a disciplinary or deactivation decision, the employer must demonstrate that the employer did not primarily rely upon an ADS or that the employer complied with those provisions and those that require an employer to provide a postuse notice, when making the disciplinary or termination decision, as specified. The Assembly amendments make the \$500 civil penalty described above applicable per violation.

SB 947, as it passed the Senate, provided that its provisions do not prohibit any employer from complying with regulatory or contractual requirements in the provision of products or services to the federal government, as defined.

The Assembly amendments, instead, provide that the bill's provisions do not apply to the use of an ADS relating to the development of aircraft for use in the national airspace or the development of products or services for national security, military, space, or defense purposes, if the use of an ADS is reasonably necessary to comply with the federal statute, the federal regulation, or the binding federal contract, as specified.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 1087, as it passed the Senate, (1) revised the requirements for a regional transportation plan’s sustainable communities strategy, (2) required the California Transportation Commission to adopt guidelines for the preparation of sustainable communities strategies, (3) exempted the preparation and adoption of regional transportation plans, sustainable communities strategies, and alternative planning strategies from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), (4) required the Department of Transportation to coordinate with regional transportation planning agencies and metropolitan planning organizations on regionally significant projects as part of the state highway operation and protection program (SHOPP), and (5) repealed a requirement in the Solutions for Congested Corridors Program (SCCP) for a project to be part of a comprehensive corridor.

The Assembly amendments (1) further revise the requirements for a sustainable communities strategy, (2) delete the requirement for the commission to adopt guidelines for sustainable communities strategies, (3) delete the CEQA exemption described above, (4) delete the coordination requirement for the SHOPP, and (5) delete the repeal of the SCCP requirement. The Assembly amendments also (6) revise requirements for the California Transportation Plan, (7) add new restrictions on the use of funds in the Public Transportation Account, and (8) add new requirements on the grant guide for certain grants allocated from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 423, as it passed the Senate, required the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation and the office of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, on or before January 1, 2028, to expand access to community college courses that lead to degrees and certificates in specified subjects including, among other subjects, fire science, for individuals serving in California Conservation Corps handcrews or institutional firehouses, as provided. SB 423, as it passed the Senate, required, upon appropriation by the Legislature, the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, in collaboration with the California Conservation Corps and the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, to operate an enhanced firefighter training and certification program at the Ventura Training Center in the County of Ventura, or its successor facility. SB 423, as it passed the Senate, authorized the fire chief of the County of Los Angeles Fire Department, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to establish the Local Handcrew Pilot Program for 5 years and authorized the fire chief to enroll in the pilot program formerly incarcerated individuals who have successfully completed specified programs, training, or work. SB 423, as it passed the Senate, required the fire chief to develop metrics for evaluating the efficacy and success of the pilot program, to evaluate the efficacy and success of the pilot program using those metrics, and to report the findings of the evaluation to the Legislature and the Governor, as provided. SB 423, as it passed the Senate, made legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute for the Ventura Training Center in the County of Ventura.

The Assembly amendments delete those provisions, and instead, specify that a recording of a call or a written communication that is maintained by a state or local agency that reports or describes an incident, as defined, occurring at a private detention facility, and specified records relating to that call or communication in the possession of a law enforcement agency, are not confidential, and require an agency to disclose those records upon request to any member of the public. The Assembly amendments except the above-described records and writings from the provisions of existing law that otherwise would not require the disclosure of certain related documents, except as provided. The Assembly amendments, pursuant to provisions of the California Constitution, make legislative findings relating to the constitutional

SB 715, as it passed the Senate, removed the requirement that the loss of units during an emergency declared by the Governor be considered as a factor by a council of governments, or delegate subregion as applicable, when developing the methodology that allocates regional housing needs. SB 715 required lost units be distributed proportionally according to the region's proposed methodology and prohibited lost units from solely being distributed to the jurisdictions in which they were lost.

The Assembly amendments delete those provisions and instead move the deadline for the Secretary of State to notify the candidates for partisan and voter-nominated offices of the names, addresses, offices, occupations, and party preferences of all other candidates for the same office from at least 73 days before the election to at least 78 days before the election. The Assembly amendments move other specified deadlines earlier. The Assembly amendments require a candidate to certify, under penalty of perjury, the truth and accuracy of the content of the ballot designation worksheet. The Assembly amendments incorporate changes made by SB 1360 if SB 715 and SB 1360 are both enacted and become effective on or before January 1, 2027, and SB 715 is enacted after SB 1360, thereby preserving the changes made by SB 1360 that would otherwise be deleted if SB 715 is enacted last.

The Assembly amendments prohibit the total reimbursable indirect costs from exceeding 35% of the total grant award. The Assembly amendments additionally make public or private universities, school districts, and community colleges eligible to receive grants from the fund and authorize the Secretary of Environmental Protection to request information from grant recipients in a manner and format determined by the secretary.
